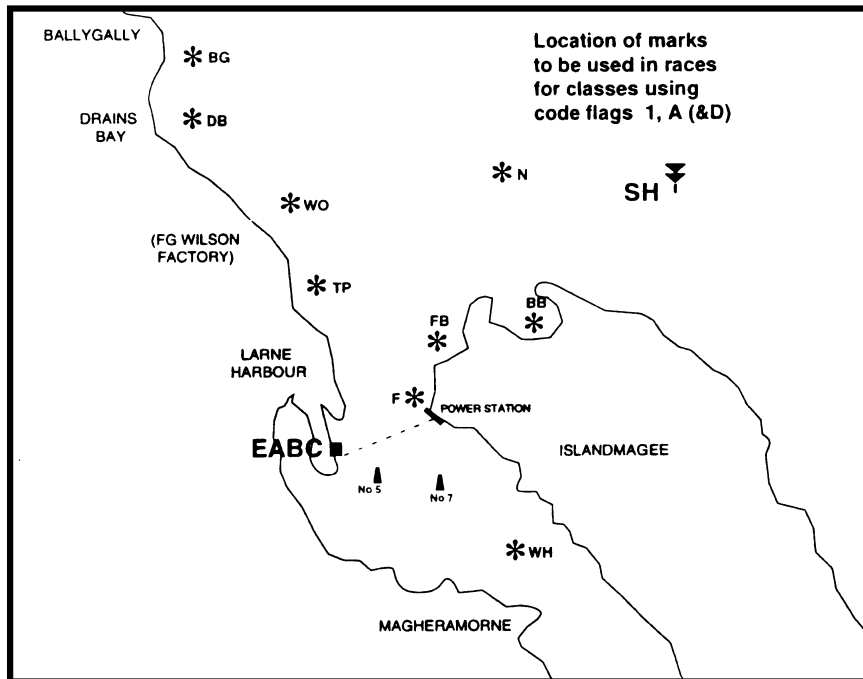

SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

11. Sailing instructions (SIs) Nos. 1 to 8 are contained within this year's Belfast Lough Yachting Conference (BLYC) Regatta Programme and are applicable to this Regatta. BLYC SIs 9 & 10 shall not apply to this Regatta.
12. **STARTING**
The location of the start line and the type of committee boat will be posted in the clubhouse on the Official Notice Board.
13. **FINISHING**
The location of the finishing line(s) will be posted in the clubhouse on the Official Notice Board.
14. **TIME LIMIT**
The time limit for each race is two hours. If, in any race one boat completes the course within this time, the time limit will be extended by 30 minutes. In the event of a class failing to finish a second or subsequent round (or course) within the time limit, the timings at the end of the last completed round shall be taken as the result of the race. This SI amends RRS 35.
15. **COURSES**
Descriptions of the courses to be sailed will be posted in the clubhouse on the Official Notice Board prior to the start of each race. Where possible, Olympic style courses will be sailed.

RIGHT OF WAY (SPECIAL NOTE)

You are reminded that cross channel and 'fast' ferries manoeuvre in the approaches to and within Lame Lough. Yachts must accord right-of-way to vessels in Lame Lough.

YOU HAVE ABSOLUTELY NO RIGHT OF WAY (even if becalmed). You are advised to use the Power Station side of the Lough where possible to avoid danger from, and inconvenience to, commercial shipping.
